

AWGA PAYOUT PROCEDURES

Thursday League Play

The AWGA 18-hole league play is scheduled from the 2nd Thursday in March through the last Thursday in October. The Thursday “pot” game fee is \$4.00 per person. The number of handicap divisions (flights) depends on the number of women playing in the game that day. Generally, the total number of women is divided into 3 divisions. The number of divisions will vary with the number of participants to provide a more equitable handicap spread. The goal is to pay as many women as possible and generally 1/3 of the women are paid. If there are ties, the money is split between those who have tied.

The categories to be paid will vary with the type of game, i.e., individual, team. Typically, there will be at least two payouts in each flight.

Low Gross (1st and 2nd place)

Low Net (1st and 2nd place)

If there are sufficient participants, the number of flights will be adjusted to reflect an equitable payout.

Special games, including tournaments, may involve different payouts; for example a “Putts Day” would pay putts by flight, and may or may not pay gross and net.

Birdies:

For each regular league game, \$.50 of the pot fee is set aside to pay birdies. Birdie money is paid to any woman who scores a gross birdie on any hole during a league game. The birdie pot will be divided among the flights (divisions). Each flight will have a separate pot. If no one in a flight scores a birdie, that amount of money will be returned to the general payout for that flight for that day. These payout guidelines may be different for tournaments and special games not limited to the Invitational, Member-Guest, or other special events.

If you do not complete 18 holes, but have completed at least 9 holes, you are still eligible to receive the birdie payout money.

Payouts:

- Payouts for Thursday league play are decided by the Pro Shop with input from the Golf Chair.
- Winnings will be credited to your Pro Shop account.
- Certain game formats allow payout eligibility even if you did not play all 18 holes, such as Nassau, F&T or other identified games.
- There is a Sunday pot game operated by Arrowhead Golf Club. The cost is \$5.00 and is for both men and women. The Sunday game is not considered part of the AWGA league play.

Arrowhead Golf Club WOMEN'S CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

This event is conducted by Arrowhead Golf Club (AGC) with the cooperation and endorsement of AWGA.

AWGA recommends the following procedures for the AGC Women's Club Championship:

- Pay 1/3 of the field
- Gross and Net Champion of the field will receive a larger share of the winnings in equal payouts
- Gross and Net payouts for the rest of the field will be equal in amount and number paid
- Number of divisions will be determined by the number of participants
- All entry fee payments collected will be paid out in prize winnings
- AWGA, at the discretion of the Board, may subsidize the entry fee

AWGA HOLE-IN-ONES

Qualifications:

- Any woman who is currently a member of AWGA
- Hole-in-One must have been achieved at Arrowhead Golf Course
- Must be at least a twosome
- Must have played at least nine holes
- Must turn in a signed and attested score card
- Can be recognized from a temporary tee, but will not be recognized from a temporary green (AGC may elect to recognize this achievement)

Any member meeting the qualifications and making a hole in one will receive \$200.00 from AGC.

Dues:

At the beginning of each calendar year members will be billed, in addition to their handicap fee and AWGA dues, ten dollars (\$10.00) for the hole-in-one fund. This money will be billed and collected by AGC.

Should the reserves to pay a hole-in-one fall below the amount needed for pay-outs, each member will be assessed at a minimum \$5.00. A representative of AGC will inform the AWGA Board that an assessment is needed. The Board will discuss and agree to an additional payment.

Recognition:

- In addition to the monetary payout, AGC may elect to provide the individual with recognition and/or compensation
- An AGC representative should be notified for inclusion in newsletter
- OGA may acknowledge the achievement with an announcement and a small token

Process:

Individual making the hole-in-one should notify the Pro Shop, who then gives the individual the AGC award and notifies the AWGA Oregon Golf Association (OGA) Representative.

AWGA CHIP-INS

A chip-in occurs when the ball goes into the hole, after being struck with one legitimate golf stroke from off the green.

Qualifications:

- Be a member in good standing of the AWGA ladies club
- Chip-in must be made on Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday or Sunday while playing 9 or 18 holes at Arrowhead golf course
- All officially sanctioned AWGA or AGC events are included
- You do not have to be in the league "pot" game to participate on identified days
- There must at least one other AWGA member present

Process:

Upon completion of that round of golf, the golfer will write her name on the AWGA bulletin board under "chip-ins". Information should include name and hole number.

Payouts:

- The golfer who scores the most chip-ins for the specified time period receives the full amount allocated
- If two or more individuals tie, the "pot" will be split among them
- January & February: All eligible days are combined; payout is \$45.00
- March through October: Tuesday and Thursday are paid \$15.00 each, monthly
- Saturday and Sunday are treated as one weekend; monthly payout of \$15.00
- November & December: All eligible days are combined; payout is \$45.00
- Results will be tallied and paid in cash at the end of each time period
