

EC Guidelines for AWGA

An EC score is the best gross score a golfer has on each hole of a golf course over a set amount of time. A golfer's final EC score combines their lowest scores on each hole showing what they would score if all of those scores were in the same round.

Qualifications:

- Be a member in good standing of the AWGA ladies club
- Play 9 or 18 postable holes on Thursday at Arrowhead starting on the first AWGA game day in March through the Thursday before closing day in October with a tee time between 7 am and 12:30 pm
- Scores from both days of Club Championship are also eligible
- Golfers do not have to be in the league "pot" game to participate
- There must at least one other AWGA member present
- Scores on holes with temporary greens cannot be used to improve EC score

Process:

After a golfer's first eligible **Thursday** round, they will circle their scores for each hole on their EC card. For all other eligible rounds, golfers will circle a different score only when a score on a hole is improved. Previous scores stay on the card and are not erased.

EC cards will be filed alphabetically by last name in a container in the pro shop. Golfers are responsible for updating EC cards after each Thursday AWGA postable score and both days of the Club Championship. Please update cards weekly.

Payouts:

- Winners will be announced at AWGA closing day luncheon.
- There will be gross and net winners. 75% of handicap on October 15th will be used to determine net winners.
- Flights will be divided equally based on handicap.
